## 2006 Annual Survey of Social Work Programs

In 2006, 509 institutions with 458 accredited baccalaureate programs, 181 accredited master's programs, and 69 doctoral programs (Group for the Advancement of Doctoral Education, GADE members) were sent the CSWE Annual Survey of Social Work Programs via electronic invitation. Response rates in 2006 showed an increase from 2004 for both baccalaureate ( $94.5 \%$ up from $75.8 \%$ ) and master's ( $95.6 \%$ up from $84.4 \%$ ) programs, while doctoral programs showed a decrease ( $88.4 \%$ down from $95.4 \%$ ).

## Social Work Students

Field Placements In 2006, master's programs reported 26,625 students with assigned field placements.
( Mental Health/Community Mental Health had the highest percentage of students (20.9\%), followed by Child Welfare (14.9\%), Family Services (11.3\%), and School Social Work (11.3\%).

In 2006, baccalaureate programs reported 15,231 students with assigned field placements.
( The highest concentration of students was in Child Welfare (19.0\%), followed by Family Services (12.9\%), and School Social Work (9.0\%).

## 2006 Annual Survey of Social Work Programs

## Faculty Information

Data on social work faculty were received from 480 of 484 programs responding, that is $99.2 \%$ of respondents or $94.3 \%$ of all social work programs. The Faculty Section of the Annual Survey asked respondents to report the percentage of a full-time equivalent (FTE) each faculty member spent in social work education and other institutional responsibilities. For the purposes of this Research Brief, "full-time" refers to those faculty members who spend 50\% or more of an FTE in social work education.

Programs reported 8,082 faculty (6,017 full-time and 2,065 parttime) having time assigned to social work. This is a $17.9 \%$ increase over the reported faculty in $2004(6,857)$, due at least in part to the increased response rate. In 2006,

- $63.9 \%$ of full-time faculty and $67.3 \%$ of part-time faculty were female
( Almost 38\% of full-time faculty and slightly more than 3\% of part-time faculty had tenure
( $92.2 \%$ of full-time faculty and $88.7 \%$ of all part-time faculty had an MSW
. $39.5 \%$ of full-time faculty reported an MSW as their highest degree compared to $74.4 \%$ of part-time faculty
- $41.7 \%$ of full-time faculty reported a doctoral degree in social work as their highest degree compared to just $9.8 \%$ of part-time faculty

Faculty salary (below) is reported only for full-time Professors, Associate Professors, and Assistant Professors that reported no administrative title. Only $84.2 \%(n=2,126)$ of faculty meeting the above criteria reported salary information. This is an increase compared to 2004 data, which indicated $78.2 \%(1,669)$ of faculty meeting the above criteria reported salary information. Most noteworthy, is the $16 \%$ gain in median salary of full professors working in graduate only programs between 2004 and 2006 ( $\$ 101,313$ in 2006 up from $\$ 87,324$ in 2004).
