**Educator | Resource of the Month**

The Center's newest initiative, the [Educator | Resource of the Month](#) is gaining traction among CSWE membership. Thus far, we have featured three educators who are experts in their field and who have presented rich teaching resources. We have participants lined up through May. Topics range from literary resources for social justice to podcasts focused on social work in the field. Each month's installment is showcased on the Center's website homepage, then [archived](#) in the Educator | Resource-specific section. We hope to make this a venue for monthly dissemination of social work curriculum resources. Our goal is to make the Diversity Center the national go-to place for innovative resources in diversity and justice for social work education. [Strategic Goal #2, #3, #5]

**Website Traffic Increases**

From November 1 to January 31, the Diversity Center's website has received 861 page views (approx. 287/month) with spikes of 50% surrounding announcements of the Educator | Resource in *Compass*. For context, between August 1, 2018 and October 31, 2018, the Center received 542 total pageviews, indicating a 37% increase in viewership over the last three months. [Strategic Goal #6]

**Special Issue on "Advances Social Work Practice with Multicultural Communities"**

A special issue spearheaded by the Diversity Center is to be published in late February in the *Journal of Ethnic & Cultural Diversity in Social Work*. **Work with Councils and Affiliated Groups of the Commission on Diversity and Social and Economic Justice**
