Description of Program: The SAMHSA Minority Fellowship Program (MFP) was designed to help reverse the disparities that exist in mental health services and improve the quality of those services to minority populations through the training of additional minority mental health professionals. The purpose of the program is to provide stipends to doctoral level students to increase the number of culturally competent behavioral health professionals who teach, administer, conduct services research, and provide direct mental health and substance abuse services to underserved populations. The Program provides competitive fellowship funding to promote the entry of students looking to serve in underserved communities. This continues to be an important program as the mental health needs of minority populations in the United States have been, and continue to be, grossly underserved. Evidence has shown that minority mental health professionals practice in underserved areas at a higher rate than non-minorities, and a direct positive relationship exists between the numbers of minority mental health professionals and the utilization of needed services by ethnic minorities.

The program received a total of \$5,706,000 in FY 2013 through the *Consolidated and Further Continuing Appropriations Act of 2013* (\$5,089,000 in CMHS, \$546,000 in CSAT, and \$71,000 in CSAP).
