A Warm Welcome from FRC Chair, Dr. Christopher Guenthner



CSWE is pleased to announce the newly appointed chair of the <u>Fellowship Review Committee (FRC)</u>, Dr. Christopher Guenthner, DSW, LCSW, BCD, LTC, MS. Dr. Guenthner will serve as FRC chair through June 2026.

Having spent over 19 years in clinical and academic behavioral health administration as a United States Army Social Work Officer, Dr. Guenthner is currently the Installation Director of Psychological Health (IDPH) at Schofield Barracks, Hawaii. His leadership focuses on providing behavioral health care to servicemembers and their families. Chris focuses on educating the next generation of Social Work Officers while developing civilian and activeduty clinicians. As the IDPH, Chris engages daily with senior military officials and community representatives to help maintain the readiness of servicemembers to deploy.

Dr. Guenthner has been involved in post-master's social work fellowship accreditation since 2019. Dr. Guenther served as program director of Walter Reed National Military Medical Center's National Capital Consortium Social Work Fellowship in Child and Family Practice, one of the four post-master's social work fellowship programs to participate in the accreditation pilot from 2019-2022. Under his leadership, Walter Reed National Military Medical Center's National Capital Consortium Social Work Fellowship in Child and Family Practice was the first post-master's social work fellowship in Child and Family Practice was the first post-master's social work fellowship program to obtain initial accreditation.

Soon after his program achieved initial accreditation in June 2021, Dr. Guenthner continued his involvement in post-master's social work fellowship accreditation by serving on the Fellowship Review Committee (FRC). Dr Guenthner has served as a member of the FRC since June 2022.

Dr. Guenthner shared, "I am honored to serve as the newly appointed chair of the Fellowship Review Committee (FRC). I am excited to work with the talented folks who volunteer for the FRC, and all CSWE colleagues to support and promote the accreditation of Social Work Fellowships."

CSWE's Board of Accreditation (BOA) Accredits Fifth Fellowship Program

At the <u>October 2024 meeting</u>, CSWE's Board of Accreditation (BOA) granted initial accreditation to Texas A&M University's Post Graduate Clinical Social Work Fellowship.



This is the first fellowship program to receive initial accreditation since the post-master's social work fellowship

accreditation pilot concluded in 2022. This is also the first fellowship program to have been reviewed under the <u>Post-Master's Social Work Fellowship Accreditation Standards</u> that were approved and adopted by the BOA in 2021.

CSWE congratulates Texas A&M University on this achievement. There are now 5 accredited post master's social work fellowship programs:

- Walter Reed National Military Medical Center's National Capital Consortium Social Work Fellowship in Child and Family Practice

Fellowship Accreditation Process Information

Fellowship programs accredited by the Council on Social Work Education (CSWE)'s Board of Accreditation (BOA) provide training and supervision to master's-level social work practitioners within one or more defined areas of social work practice.

Unlike the academic programs accredited by BOA, fellowship programs are practice-based and not tied to degree programs in colleges and universities. The purpose of fellowship training is for trainees to obtain advanced competencies and/or core expertise and skills beyond those attained through completion of a master's degree in social work.

CSWE's Fellowship Review Committee (FRC) serves as the primary review body for fellowship programs seeking initial or continued accreditation and is responsible for making accreditation decision recommendations to the BOA. The FRC is comprised of social work educators and practitioners to ensure a peer-review based accreditation process for post-master's social work fellowship programs.
